
"Welcome Visitors & Members!"

Pentecost Season: After reliving the great events of the life of Christ, the worshipping Church spends half a year focusing on the teachings of Christ. The Church wears green during the season of Pentecost as the Spirit uses those teachings of Jesus to grow the faith of believers. The appointed lessons teach us the characteristics of the Holy Ministry, the Christian, the Church, our God, and the Christian life.

Today is Pentecost 15. Our focus today: The Church is militant: first the cross, then the crown; first death, then life.




- C: so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. (2 Timothy 3:16,17)

²³But Jesus turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a snare to me because you are not thinking the things of God, but the things of men."




