



Second Lesson: 1 Corinthians 1:18-25

¹⁸For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved, it is the power of God. ¹⁹In fact, it is written:

I will destroy the wisdom of the wise;

the intelligence of the intelligent I will bring to nothing.

²⁰Where is the wise man? Where is the expert in the Jewish law? Where is the probing thinker of the present age? Letter from School Counselor:

"Greetings members of St. John's Lutheran Church,

I would like to begin by introducing myself. My name is Peter Micheel, and I have served as the principal at St. Mark Lutheran School in Eau Claire since 2010. I have also served as the school counselor for St. John's Lutheran School since the fall of 2014. As part of my role as school counselor, I make an annual visit to your school. This {past} Friday, February 23, I visited your school. I will briefly share a few highlights that I made during my visit.

First, I was truly amazed at the warm and welcoming school climate that radiates from your building. As soon as I entered the door, your secretary, Judy, and Pastor Biebert were there to greet me. Since I have had the opportunity to make visits for the last several years, it has also been neat to get to know each of your called teachers on a more personal basis. Each conversation becomes even more meaningful as I better get to know each one of them and their trust in me as their school counselor also grows.

Second, while meeting with your pastor and each teacher individually, I shared a brief devotional thought that focused on the apostle Paul's directions to Timothy to Continue in the things you have learned and about which you have become convinced. (II Timothy 3:14b) Our schools' missions are to assist our families with the Christian Education they desire for their children. Just like split firewood increases the surface area to burn wood more efficiently in a campfire so also our

schools increase the surface area for the Holy Scriptures as our students study the Bible on a daily basis. The Holy Spirit continues to grow their faith as they learn of God's plan of salvation through Jesus. Following the devotion, I asked each person a few questions and listened to both their joys and concerns in their various vocations. I also noted how special it is to enjoy stability among your congregation and school as you enjoy a third year with the same Called Workers. Your staff brings much experience to the table to guide them in their decision making and carrying out your school's mission. God has blessed you with a stable foundation.

I urged each of your teachers to continue to grow both professional and spiritually by making their Ministry Development Plans an active part of their ministry to support this growth. Please support and encourage them to do this.

Third, I know that your congregation still faces challenges. What a neat issue that you face in your early childhood center as you are filled to capacity and are navigating how to fit in more families that are on your waiting list! What a blessing to face such a challenge on where you can put students within your facility! At St. Mark, we too are wrestling with such an issue as well. God has greatly blessed our WELS Schools since pulling through the challenging pandemic.

Finally, I also encourage your Board of Education to continue to research in joining the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program and/or the Special Needs Scholarship Program. Both programs require a lot of time and energy, and if your school enters into these programs, it sounds like you have a member who is willing to help with much of the administrative work in this process. Both programs fit well with our schools' mission statements by providing the opportunity for both member families and families in the community to financially afford the Christian education that your school provides. It also can financially provide resources to your congregation to hire extra people to provide better support for your students that have important needs.

Thank you for the opportunity to come and visit. Your congregation and school will continue to be in my prayers.
