

WALK WITH GOD—TALK WITH GOD Prayer Also Means Listening to God "My sheep listen to my voice." -John 10:27

There was a 74-year-old man from Indiana who had paid for a flight in a small plane. He loved the excitement of flying, but had no idea what went into the actual skill of operating a plane. Pilots must go to school for many, many hours to learn the details of taking off, flying, and landing a plane safely. But the day of the old man's flight turned out to be a day he would never forget. Not long after the pilot taxied and took off from the airfield, they leveled off the plane just as they had always done. But then tragedy struck. The pilot had a sudden heart attack and the old man was helpless in directing the airplane. Panicked, he began screaming into his headset which was connected to the ground office. Help! Help! He cried. I have no idea how to fly this plane. I need help now! Fortunately for him, his S.O.S. cry for help was heard by those in the tower, and they assured the man that they would give him detailed instructions on landing the plane. The man listened intently and followed each direction as he was told. And before he knew it, he was safe on the ground once again. After his safe landing, he admitted, "I don't think I've ever listened so carefully to anyone before!"

How well would you listen to the tower? How closely would you follow each instruction, each guiding point, and each suggestion as it came down to you? That picture of the man who listened so closely can be compared to our lives and how well we listen to the heavenly tower, to God. We have said that prayer gives us an opportunity to talk with God. When we talk with people that means that sometimes we talk, and sometimes we listen. So it should be with prayer. Sometimes we talk, sometimes we listen.

The young Samuel served as a great example for us to follow when it comes to listening to what God has to say to us in prayer. You may remember the story of the young Samuel fast asleep on his cot in the tent of Eli, the priest. Three times the Lord called the sleeping Samuel. Each time Samuel thought it was Eli who was calling him. Finally Eli told Samuel to go back to bed and if he hears the Lord call again, he should pray the words, "Speak, Lord, I am listening." So Samuel went to bed again, and sure enough the voice of God called Samuel once again, and Samuel said, "Speak, Lord, I'm listening to whatever it is you have to tell me." That night God told Samuel about his plans for the people of Israel.

If Samuel had done all the talking, he would never have known that God had something to say. Such can be the case when we pray. Certainly we want to share with God everything that is on our minds. And sometimes that may be quite a bit. But we should always remember that God also wants to impress upon us certain thoughts, certain ways of seeing things around us, and certain feelings. God may not come to us in a voice as he did with Samuel, but God does speak to us through our teachers, through reading his Word, and through our consciences. When he comes to us, we should be open and ready to listen to what he has to say. And then we should be willing to follow his every suggestion. Isaiah tells us about listening to God this way, "Whether you turn to the right or to the left, your ears will hear a voice behind you saying, 'This is the way; walk in it'" (Isaiah 30:21).
