Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. "By him we cry, 'Abba, Father." (Romans 8:25)

For three years Jesus lived with his disciples. These men traveled throughout the land of Palestine as they watched Jesus heal the sick and care for the hurting. No doubt many nights were spent around a campfire asking Jesus all sorts of questions. The Bible tells us in Luke 11 that one day some of the disciples watched Jesus take time to pray. But instead of using any of those awesome names, Jesus simply said we should call him Father. That name doesn't sound quite as awesome, does it? One who gives them clothes and food and a home. He will care for them when they are sick and teach them how to act as they grow older. He will do his very best to care for all their needs because he loves his children very much. That's the way Jesus teaches us to come to our God. He wants us to see him as a loving Father who wants to know all about us and wants to be an important part of our lives.

Once the Apostle Paul was writing about how God's children look at him. He said that because we are God's sons and daughters, we can call him a very special intimate name, "Abba, Father." We don't use the word Abba too much today, do we? But many years ago that word meant daddy. In other words, Paul said when we speak to God we can call him our Daddy Father. Although the word Father shows love and care, the word daddy is even more personal. When we are at home as a family, we can call our fathers daddy. That means we are very close to the man. We are in a loving and personal relationship with him. God our Father also wants us to call him daddy. He wants us to spend time with him as we would our own dads. He wants to hear us share all our problems and successes with him. He wants to hear how much we love him, and that we are thankful for everything his goodness has given to us.

What a beautiful thing it is when we speak the Lord's Prayer and remember first of all who it is we are speaking to, our Daddy Father, our loving, gracious, and forgiving dad. He is the very same Father to our brother Jesus. Isn't it wonderful to know we are part of God's family? What more could we ever hope for?
