The Five-Finger Prayer

"We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you."
-Colossians 1:3

There are certainly many ways we can pray, and many things we can say to our Lord in our prayers. Sometimes it is good to have a plan set down before we begin to pray, that way we don't ramble along or forget to say some things we wish we would. Someone helped us make such a plan when they designed the five-finger prayer. It's an unusual name, but it may be helpful to you sometime in the future.

To use the five-finger prayer, first begin by folding your hands in front of you. Keep your eyes open so you can see what is done next. You will notice that the finger closest to you is your thumb. The thumb reminds us to begin our prayer for those closest to us. That means we could include our parents and brothers and sisters. We could ask the Lord to watch over them and protect them, and to strengthen their faith. We might even ask for healing or help in facing a difficult situation for someone close to us.

The next finger we call the index finger. Sometimes we call it the pointer because we use this finger to point to things. Our next part in our prayer is meant for those who lead us or point us in the right way. That would include our teachers and pastors. They dedicate their lives to pointing us to heaven. We must remember to thank God for these helpful people on our list.

The next finger is the tallest finger. It leads the other fingers in length. That should then remind us to pray for those who lead us. That might include our president, our mayor, and representatives in the government. We pray that God would lead them to live godly lives and make godly decisions. To be good leaders they need to follow the way God would have them go. The fourth finger is the one on which we place our rings, so it is called the ring finger. Of all the fingers, this one is the weakest. It's the one hardest to train to type or play piano because of its weakness. Yet it can remind us to remember in our prayers those who are weakest. That would include sick people, and people who cannot care for themselves.

Finally, we come to the little finger. This is the least significant of all the fingers. And so we save the last words of our prayer for ourselves. The little finger should remind us to ask God for guidance, strength, and protection.

Now when we wish to pray for others, we can just remember our five-finger prayer. Here we will pray for those closest to us, our leaders, those who point us in the right way, those who are weak, and ourselves. What a wonderful prayer plan to follow!
