Why Do We Pray At Meals?

"When you have eaten and are satisfied, praise the LORD your God for the good land he has given you." -Deuteronomy 8:10

Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest, and let these gifts to us be blest. O give thanks unto the Lord, for he is good. His mercy endures forever. Have you ever heard those words before? Maybe they sound familiar because we often use those two prayers before and after our meals. As God's children, many of us use the practice of saying grace or praying before and after every meal. The idea of thanking God for our food dates all the way back to the Bible. We can begin by paging back to Deuteronomy where it says, "When you have eaten and are satisfied, praise the Lord your God for the good land he has given you." Jewish families were used to saying thanks to God for his goodness at each meal.

Jesus was no exception. Do you know what Jesus did before he handed out the bread and fish at the miraculous feeding of the 5000? Matthew 14:19 says, "And [Jesus] directed the people to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves." The words that Jesus prayed were probably the same ones used by most Jews at that time. His prayer probably was much like this: "Blessed art Thou, Jehovah our God, King of the world, who causes to come forth bread from the earth." We also read when Jesus was about to celebrate the first Communion, the Bible says, "Jesus took bread, gave thanks, and broke it" (Matthew 26:16). The believers in the early Christian church kept up that wonderful practice. We read in Acts 27:35 that Paul "took some bread and gave thanks to God in front of them all."

We do well to continue the practice of praying before and after each meal. Usually before the meal we ask God to come and bless our food. That's when we often pray, "Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest, and let these gifts to us be blest." That prayer is not found anywhere in the Bible. In fact, it seems that when we trace the words to that prayer, we notice that it dates back to the early Lutherans who enjoyed praying those words and passed them down to their children. Following the meal, we like to say thank you to God for giving us the blessings that we enjoyed. That's when we often say, "O give thanks unto the Lord, for he is good. His mercy endures forever." Those words date all the way back to the book of 1 Chronicles when David said a prayer of thanks. But that's not the only place we find them. The exact same words are repeated in Psalms 107, 118, and 136. Certainly God never commands us to pray before and after meals, but it is a wonderful way for us to show our gratitude to God for being so good to us. Make it your practice as well!
