

WALK WITH GOD—TALK WITH GOD Where Should We Pray?

"When you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you." -Matthew 6:6

Where is your favorite place to pray? Many people like to pray when they are lying in bed. Some pray on their knees beside their beds. Others like to be in a room all by themselves as they talk with the Lord. What can we learn about where we should pray?

In school, we pray sitting behind a desk or standing. In church, we often stand at the church seat and pray. Can you remember where some of our Bible friends were when they prayed? The Apostle Peter once prayed when he was standing on top of a roof. People of the early church enjoyed meeting down by the river to pray. The Bible tells us that Paul and Silas prayed when they were locked up in a jail cell. In the Old Testament we hear of Gideon who prayed while he was working in the barn threshing wheat. And, of course, we remember Samuel speaking to God while lying on his bed late one night. Jesus often went off into the hills where he could be alone to talk with his Father.

Did you know that someone prayed from inside a fish? That would be Jonah. We know the story of Jonah, the prophet who tried to run away from the task God had given him. While running, there arose a frightening storm that was about to capsize the boat in which Jonah was sailing. So, he asked the sailors to throw him into the sea to appease God's anger. Down, down he sank into the sea until he was eaten by a huge fish. And there he stayed for three days. Remember what he did during that time? What would you do? Jonah prayed. His prayer is very interesting to read. This is what Jonah said to God: "In my distress I called to you, the LORD, and he answered me. From the depths of the grave I called for help, and you listened to my cry. You hurled me into the deep, into the very heart of the seas, and the currents swirled around me; all your waves and breakers swept over me. The engulfing waters threatened me, the deep surrounded me; seaweed was wrapped around my head. But you brought my life up from the pit, O LORD my God. I remembered you, LORD, and my prayer rose to you. With a song of thanksgiving I will sacrifice to you" (Jonah 2).

We know that the Lord heard Jonah, even from the belly of that fish. After he prayed, Jonah was spit out onto dry ground where he could once again carry out God's commands.

So, where should we pray? Jesus gave a suggestion when he said, "When you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you." That is an ideal place where we can concentrate so we can talk to God without any distractions. Jesus didn't mean we can't be elsewhere when we pray. Jesus heard the criminal's prayer when he was hanging on the cross. Wherever we happen to be is a great place to talk with God. God will hear us if we are riding our bicycle, seated at a basketball game, in a boat fishing, or in the middle of the night. It is our prayers that count, not where we are or what hour of the day it might be. God loves to listen to us!
