Then when tomorrow comes, he wants us to come to him again, and ask for his blessings just for tomorrow. When the Israelites were in the desert, God gave them a special food called manna. Each morning the people would go out and pick up manna off the ground. But they could only take as much as they needed for one day, for if they kept it overnight, it would be spoiled rotten by next morning. God was teaching them to rely on him to provide their food each day. That's what he is trying to teach us in the Lord's Prayer. Jesus loves it when we rely on him for our blessings every day. He wants to hear us ask again every day of the week.

Of course, the Lord's Prayer is asking for much more than food. We are praying that God would daily give us shelter and clothing, safety and health. All our daily needs are summed up in those few words that Jesus taught us to pray. Let's remember to ask Jesus every day for the blessings we need.
