WALK WITH GOD—TALK WITH GOD

"Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil."

"When tempted, no one should say, 'God is tempting me.' For God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does he tempt anyone; but each person is tempted when they are dragged away by their own evil desire and enticed."
-James 1:13-14

Did you ever have a problem understanding the words: "Lead us not into temptation"? Why would we ask God not to lead us into temptation? Isn't God a loving God? What kind of loving God would lead his children into temptation? Is God really that cruel? Don't feel bad, a lot of people have had this misunderstanding initially when learning about the Lord's Prayer.

Perhaps it can be explained with a short picture story. A father was taking his daughters on a trip that took them though a huge forest. Since it was getting dark, he decided to turn on the car's headlights. However, they were dim and barely lit anything. The car's battery would soon be dead. What would they do then? The girls were frightened of the dark and scary place. But dad knew exactly where the road would lead. All he asked of his daughters was that they would stay close to him. "Don't worry, daddy," one of the girls said as she squeezed her dad's hand, "we'll stick to you tight like super-glue!"

There will come times in our lives that will be much like the trip in our story. Sometimes life can take us into the darkest forests. A parent can lose their job so we will need to sell our house and move away to another neighborhood. A family member has cancer and must stay in a hospital room for many weeks. Those who we thought were our best friends have talked bad about us, deserted us and left us all alone. No matter how hard we try, we just cannot seem to pass a test in school. It's terrible having to listen to mom and dad arguing and yelling at each other.

Each of us will be led through a different forest where we will be left with a "broken down automobile." Left on our own we would all be completely lost and hopeless. But in the story, it was that dad who knew the way out. In our lives that dad is God, our closest Friend, our Father! He knows the way. That's why the first two words in this part of the Lord's Prayer is "lead us." Jesus has said he will be the leader. We just need to stick to him like super-glue.

Think about some of the stories we have talked about each week this school year already. They were in some dark and scary places in their lives that we can only imagine. Yet they stuck to Jesus like glue. Think about stories from the Bible like the misfortune Joseph went through, the trials Daniel needed to put up with, or the torture Paul endured. God tells us that there will be trials in all our lives, but with each trial he has promised to walk us through it. His plan is always to deliver us from the evil that lurks around every corner. We only need to confidently take hold of his hand, knowing that he knows the way out of the woods because he's already been there.
