WALK WITH GOD—TALK WITH GOD

"For yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever."

"He will lead them to springs of living water." (Revelation 7:17)

We enjoy praying the Lord's Prayer because it is a complete prayer for everyone to pray, and, of course, it was taught to us by Jesus himself. Today we will look at part six of the prayer, "For yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever." When we pray this wonderful phrase we are really mentioning things that explain the **AWESOMENESS** of our God. This part of the prayer <u>takes the focus completely off of us</u> and trains our eyes to look only at the **GREATNESS** of God. What a wonderful way to end this prayer.

Yours is the kingdom! The first of the four descriptions that we use is that God owns everything. He is so great that he created and controls the tiniest microorganism to the greatest galaxies in the universe. There is nothing that happens in the vast universe that he does not know about. The Bible says God knows when we lose just a tiny hair, and when a small sparrow dies. Yes, God owns a vast kingdom. The Bible says, "His kingdom rules over all" (Psalm 103:19). Isn't it a blessing to know that we are part of the inner circle in his great kingdom?

Next, we say that God has **all power**. We all know what it means to be powerful. We know of Marvel superheroes or Batman. But God's power is so much greater. Just think, he handles the weather, the wind and storms, the heat and tornadoes. And only God has the power to heal us when we get a tiny cut, or when we suffer from cancer. Not only that, he is able to raise us up from the dead. We say that God is omnipotent, or all-powerful. What a blessing knowing that the all-powerful God is on our side and is ready to fight our battles for us. The Bible says, "Great is the Lord, and mighty in power" (Psalm 147:5).

The third description we use about God is that **his is the glory**. When we use the word glory we speak of the admiration we have for God, the praise that is his only, the honor that we display before him, and the worship that is due him. Certainly, God is worthy of all glory. The Bible says, "The heavens declare the glory of God" (Psalm 19:1). Let us give all glory to God!

The last word we use to describe God is **forever**. It's no secret that God existed forever before he made the world, and he will be forever into the future. It is because he is eternal that he offers to let us share in his eternalness forever in heaven. What greater gift could we ever hope for? The Bible says, "He is the living God, the eternal King" (Jeremiah 10:10).

The next time that you pray the Lord's Prayer, take time to reflect on the words and the deep meanings behind everything that we are asking our AWESOME God. Believe it! Trust it! Live by it!
