# WALK WITH GOD—TALK WITH GOD "Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us." "He forgives all my sins." -Psalm 103:3

The story is told of a husband and wife who had been married for fifteen years. During that time minor irritations sometimes grew into major arguments. In hopes of solving this nagging problem, the wife suggested that each take a box and label it "Fault Box." Each time the one would upset the other, a slip was added to the box. Hopefully at the end of the month they would compare complaints. During the thirty days, the wife was diligent in adding slips to her box. "Didn't put the lid on the jelly jar," "left his dirty socks on the floor again," "forgot to put gas in the car." By the end of the month her box was filled with complaints. After the thirty days were up, the two boxes were opened. First the wife pulled out her complaints slip by slip. When she was done, the husband opened his box filled with slips. But the wife soon discovered that on each slip were the same words: "I forgive you," "I forgive you," "I forgive you."

Forgiveness is a very important part in the life of a child of God. That's why Jesus felt the need to mention it in the prayer he modeled for us. But did you notice, he mentions two types of forgiveness. First we ask God to "forgive us our sins." And what a long list that is! Can you imagine how many sins you have added to the list just this past week? The number might shock you. And that not only includes those things you should not have done, but also those things that you didn't do which you should have. That's why the psalm writer said, "If you, O Lord, kept a record of sins, O Lord, who could stand?" But thanks to Jesus' death on the cross, our sins have been forgiven, all of them. That's why we call him our Savior. And not only are our sins forgiven, God will never look on them again. They are gone. The slate is wiped clean. And God will never bring them up again. So when the pastor announces on Sunday morning that your sins are forgiven, rest assured they are all gone.

Jesus also felt the need to add a second part on forgiveness in his prayer. He went on to say, "As we forgive those who sin against us." Peter must have been annoyed with someone when he asked Jesus how many times he needed to keep forgiving someone who sinned against him. "Do I have to forgive him as many as seven times? Even if he keeps on sinning?" Jesus turned to Peter and said, "Seven isn't enough times. You should at least forgive him seven times seventy times." That's over 490 times! Isn't that way too much? Jesus wanted Peter to see how many times God has already forgiven us for the same sins. No doubt those numbers are way beyond 490 times.

But forgiving someone who has severely wronged us is not an easy thing to do. Could you forgive the drunken driver who rams your car and causes you great injury? God says yes, no matter what the circumstances, we must be willing to forgive. Jesus once said, "When you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive him, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you your sins" (Mark 11:25). What lessons in forgiveness we learn every time we pray the Lord's Prayer!
