What are some of the fun outdoor activities you enjoy as a child? How about running and swimming, or maybe climbing and hiking. Perhaps you enjoy some winter activities like skiing or sledding. These are all great ways to get our exercise in summer and winter. Unfortunately, there are some children who are not as fortunate. There are some children who can't enjoy strenuous activities because of a problem they must live with. Michelle Price was such a child.

Michelle was a lively little girl who loved to dance, ride horseback and ski, just like all her friends did. Her Christian parents had raised her to enjoy life to the fullest. But when Michelle turned eight, something went horribly wrong. Her right leg began to swell and caused her much pain. Doctors ran all sorts of tests, and tragically discovered that Michelle had a deadly type of bone cancer from which there was little hope of surviving. The doctors knew that to give her any chance at all, her right leg needed to be removed above the knee. "I don't want to be crippled," she sobbed. "I want to dance and have fun like the other kids." But after she thought awhile, she looked at her mom and assured her that Jesus would make it alright.

A few days later, Michelle looked down on her bandaged leg. She cried when she thought of what this would all mean for her future. Then she remembered once again that Jesus would make everything OK. For several days Michelle experienced phantom pains in her leg. These pains make the patient think that the removed limb is still attached. But her battle was not over. A few days later Michelle started with chemotherapy treatments. These powerful drugs kill the cancer cells but they cause the patient to lose their hair, vomit, and get terrible chills. But whenever visitors stopped in her room, Michelle told them that she was doing well. For eighteen months the chemotherapy continued until the day finally came that the doctors pronounced Michelle free from all cancer. During those months she was a great help to other children who were also having chemotherapy treatments at the hospital. She tried to cheer them up and tell them about the friendship she found in Jesus.

Sometime later Michelle began experimenting with skiing on one leg and skateboarding. She even entered some sports contests for handicapped people and she won many of the events.

Michelle was determined to prove that her handicap wasn't going to take away her dreams. Today Michelle is a world-class handicap skier, a fashion model, a horseback rider, and she is often invited to tell her story of hope and faith. Now a wife and mother, Michelle has started a ministry right on her ranch called Haven of Hope. Here children with disabilities are invited to learn how to ride horses and learn about Jesus. Michelle proves to each of us that although we will all meet with what seem to be impossible problems, with the help of Jesus we can continue to walk with God.

Scoring:

- Penny: +1 point (put these in your classrooms jug)

- Dime: -5 points (put these in someone else's jug)
- Quarter: -10 points (put these in someone else's jug)
- Dollar Bill: -25 points (put these in someone else's jug)
- 5 Dollar Bill: -100 points (put these in someone else's jug)
- 10 Dollar Bill: -200 points (put these in someone else's jug)
- 20 Dollar Bill: -400 points (put these in someone else's jug)

How to Play: Each classroom will have a jug that they are trying to collect the most pennies in. Other classrooms can put money into a different classrooms jug to make them lose points. (Ex. A 1st grade student can bring a \$1 bill and put it into Mr. Allard's milk jug and his class loses 25 points!) Pennies are the only way you earn points for your room, anything else you want to put in other classrooms jugs.
