

WALK WITH GOD—TALK WITH GOD Corrie Ten Boom Walked With God "Forgive as the Lord forgave you." -Colossians 3:13

Sometimes walking with God means that we must forgive others just as God forgives us. There are times when that forgiveness may be very hard for us to give. Joseph's brothers were so cruel to him that they sold him and forced him to live the rest of his life in a foreign country where he lived as a slave, spent time in prison, and rose to become a great hero of the people. Yet many years later when Joseph was reunited with his brothers, instead of cruelly punishing them for what they did to him, Joseph forgave them.

One of the tragedies of World War II was that the German Nazis hated the Jews and imprisoned, tortured and killed millions of them in concentration camps. We hear the story of a Christian named Corrie Ten Boom who along with her family in the Netherlands, spent all their resources on hiding Jews in their home in hopes of rescuing them from the hated Germans. The Ten Booms built a special false wall in Corrie's bedroom about the size of a large closet. In this false room, the Jews could hide whenever the Germans came to inspect the house. But one day in February 1944, someone tattled to the Germans about the Ten Booms secret hiding place. As a result, Corrie and her sister were arrested and put into a horrible concentration camp named Ravensbruck, where they ate little, slept on wooden bunks, and were tortured if they did not cooperate. One day Betsy, Corrie's sister, died in Corrie's arms. She said in her dying breath that there is no pit so deep that God is not deeper still.

Due to a typing error, Corrie was accidently released from that prison in December of 1944. The war ended a short time afterward and Corrie returned to the Netherlands. For years afterwards she went around the world preaching the love of Jesus. She wrote a best-selling book titled *The Hiding Place* which told of her difficult times during the war. It was later made into a Hollywood film. One day in 1947 after one of her speaking engagements, a man walked up to her who looked quite familiar. He was one of the cruelest guards at Ravensbruck. He told Corrie that he had come to know the love of Jesus and was sure that Jesus had forgiven him. Now he was asking for Corrie's forgiveness as well. What would she do? This man was responsible for the deaths of many of Corrie's friends as well as her sister. She knew what God wanted her to do. So she prayed to God that he would give her a loving heart to forgive this man. She took his hand and said to him, "I forgive you with all my heart."

People like Joseph and Corrie Ten Boom can teach us lessons on what it means to truly forgive. Let's never forget that if God is willing to forgive the many sins we commit, we should also be willing to forgive those who sin against us.
