## **How Long Does A Prayer Have To Be?**

"When you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words." -Matthew 6:7

An interesting question some might ask is how long should a prayer be? Sometimes it seems we stand for a long time in church during the prayers and hope the prayer would quickly end. Maybe you've felt that you like to keep your prayers short when you go to bed at night. Does God prefer long prayers or short ones?

That can be a very difficult question to answer. If we use Jesus as our example, we find several different answers. When Jesus prayed before feeding the 5000, he prayed a short prayer of perhaps only twenty words. Then again, we read that sometimes Jesus would go off to a quiet place and pray all night long. It all depended on the situation. We know that when Jesus prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane, he prayed so long the disciples kept falling asleep waiting for him to finish. Jesus prayed some long prayers and some short ones.

The great reformer Martin Luther once said, "If I fail to spend two hours in prayer each morning, the devil gets the victory through the day. I have so much business I cannot get on without spending three hours daily in prayer." Wow! Could you manage to pray three hours every day? That is a long time!

Think about how long we talk with our parents or friends. Sometimes we have a lot to talk about, like when we come home from school. Then we might tell our moms all sorts of things that happened during the day, or maybe we have a lot to say when we get back from an exciting vacation and we meet with our friends. We want to share all the details with them so they can enjoy the trip as much as we did. It's the very same when we talk to our heavenly Father and our Friend, Jesus. There may be times when we have a lot to say or times we have only a little to say. For instance, when Peter tried to walk on the water and began to sink, he prayed to Jesus who was standing only a few feet in front of him. Was it a long prayer? Peter's prayer had only three words, "Lord, save me!" (Matthew 14:30)

The length of our prayers makes little difference to the Lord. The important thing is that our heart is in our prayers; that we are earnestly speaking to and listening to God. If we come to the Lord with our thanks, our needs, and our praises, God will listen regardless of how long or how short the prayer is. In fact, Jesus once said that we should not be like some who feel that they will be heard because they use a lot of words. God loves to hear us talk to him. You can do it today with a few words here or there, or with a long prayer before you go to bed tonight.
