



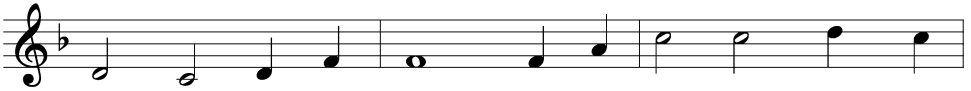

Lent 2026

The overall theme for the Lenten services for 2026 is **"It Is Finished."** This series explores the prophecies of Zechariah, offering an enriching look at our Savior Jesus, particularly as these prophecies relate to the events of Jesus' Holy Week passion, death, and resurrection.

We will have four pastors in the Lenten rotation this year, Pastor Biebert, Pastor Wilke from Globe/Christie, Pastor Oblender (vacancy pastor at Trinity), and Pastor Seefeldt (retired). On the weeks when supper is served, serving begins at **5:00 p.m.** in the school gym, and all are invited to that as well. The service schedule is below.

(There were several requests to have a 1:00 Wednesday afternoon service during Lent like we've done in the past. With the vacancy situation at Trinity, Marshfield, Pastor Wilke's busy schedule, and the LPS singers being here, it was decided after discussion that a 1:00 service would not be doable this year.)

Maternity Leave Teacher Needed: As many of you may already know, the Leiternans are expecting their next baby early April. With that wonderful news we are also actively looking to find a full-time substitute teacher that could cover Mrs. Leiterman's 4th-5th grade classroom for approximately 6 weeks. We are beginning the process of looking around our area and asking neighboring schools about potential teachers but also want to open the opportunity up to members in our own congregations. To be a substitute teacher in Wisconsin an

individual needs to have an associate's degree or higher (in any subject), be enrolled in a bachelor's degree-granting educator program, or hold a valid Wisconsin teaching license. If you are available and interested in helping St. John's in a very big way, please talk to Mr. Allard as soon as possible. We would like to solidify these plans as soon as possible. If you know of somebody who may be able to help us out, please spread the word too!

Early Enrollment Period-3K/4K: *St. John's 3K and 4K is now enrolling for the 2026-2027 school year. This may seem early but in order to work through waiting list families in the near future we need to know if any St. John's members or current St. John's School/ELC families are interested in enrolling for the next school year. The Early Enrollment period is open to St. John's families until January 31st. Please register by filling out a registration form from the school office.*

Care Packages: *Our LIGHTS group will be packing 7 care packages to be sent to college/high school students. The boxes will be packed up on Monday, February 9.*

Donations of items to include in the packages are needed and welcomed. Some ideas for donations could include: Kleenex, pens, post-it notes, hand lotion, microwave popcorn, fruit snacks, candy bars, raisins, chips, pudding, dried fruit, cookies, tea, dried soup mix, gum, soap, coffee, etc. Anything that can be individually wrapped works well; the list is almost endless. Cash donations for postage are also needed. Donations can be placed in the entryway.

Special Care "Package": *One of our members, Colin Neville, is currently living in Thailand with his wife. He is working there as an "Artist Missionary" with the Friends Network. The Friends Network (formerly Friends of China and Friends of Vietnam) is a WELS-affiliated ministry. They recruit, train, send and support lay missionaries around the world in order to build eternal friendships. We would like to show our support for Colin, but thought that the best way to do that would be to send him a monetary gift.
